This workshop set is designed to help environmental and waste professionals come up to speed on the complex area of waste classification, resource recovery, and its management. NSW environmental laws establish a complex set of legal controls on the generation, transport, re-use, recycling, treatment and disposal of wastes. There are many pitfalls and administrative processes that abound in the management of wastes in NSW. - ✓ Asbestos → management and tracking of asbestos wastes
- ✓ Use of the new Resource Recovery Exemptions and Orders → where they apply and what to do to implement them
