### SYDNEY - 27 OCTOBER 2017

This seminar will assist contaminated landowners, environmental professionals based in industry and new entrants to environmental management on recent changes and developments in the contaminated land management.

Management of contaminated soils is a focus of this seminar. Soils can be treated on site or sent off-site for either treatment or disposal can add significant costs to the remediation process. New approaches to on-site treatment to remove and concentrate contaminants are discussed, though this works for soluble and liquid contaminants like NAPL and PFASs.

Also discussed are the emerging pollutants of PFAS and asbestos and the issues they bring to contaminated land management. Development of the National Environment Management Plan on PFASs will be the main reference criteria for use by environmental agencies across Australia. Find out where it is up to.

Owners of land should approach the management of contaminated land from both a legal and a financial risk based perspective. However, grappling with liabilities, which can show up longer-term, can tend to be placed on the backburner. The seminar will discuss strategies to encourage more resources for such investigations. Site assessment should be undertaken carefully and independently to assess landholdings for such risks.
