## WORKSHOP—Storage, Handling & Risk Management

The UN's Globally Harmonised System for chemical classification and labeling has arrived in NSW. This system replaces Hazardous Substances and dangerous goods with an entirely new and expanded classification and labelling system which also affects the new Safety Data Sheets.

The workshop covers NSW's new [Work Health & Safety Regulation](#), which, incorporates the [UN's Global Harmonized System](#) (GHS) for labeling chemicals in workplaces. Australia is committed to following Europe and New Zealand in legislating GHS for chemical classification and labeling, which generally replaces hazardous substances classification.

Suppliers, manufactures, users and importers of chemicals should be aware of these coming changes. Many currently imported chemicals are classed and labeled under the GHS, which can lead to confusion. This is a practical half-day introductory workshop designed to get supervisors and managers up to speed on the expected changes which include:

- Upgrading new Safety Data Sheets to incorporate GHS information
- Ensure your chemicals are properly labelled for use in Australia
- Training so staff can understand the pictograms and labelling.

This workshop is designed for supervisors and managers who will need to implement the new GHS requirements in their hazardous chemicals management and systems.

**Facilitator:** Andrew Doig, National Director ASBG who is an excellent facilitator and has a broad background with dangerous goods, its storage and handling and management, leads this Workshop.

### WORKSHOP—Storage, Handling & Risk Management

Knowledge of dangerous goods laws and standards is an essential skill for people working with chemicals. This course is designed for supervisors and managers to learn about dangerous goods classification, classes, labelling, packaging and storage. It will answer the questions like: What are DGs? Who defines them and who regulates them? What do you have to do to comply with DG laws? What are standard control measures which can be used to better comply with the current and future legislation? What documentation and notification do I need to comply? Where do risk assessment need to undertaken?

The workshop is based *NSW's new Workplace Health & Safety Regulation*. It also touches on using the Global Harmonized System for hazardous chemicals replacing the prior hazardous substances classification.

This is a practical half-day introductory workshop designed to get supervisors and managers up to speed on NSW's dangerous goods laws storage laws. ADG7, the Code of Practice and Australian Standards on DGs and where they fit under the regulations will be explained. Supporting case studies are used to take participants through a realistic assessment of dangerous goods storages case studies to be assessed on compliance.
