The NSW [Waste Less, Recycle Initiative](#) is one of the most significant changes made to waste management in over a decade. \$465.7 million over 5 years is to comeback to waste management in various ways. Find out what the Government has planned, grants modifications to the levy, increased recycling and use of drop off centres. Reform provides some relief to the levy's current impacts on some NSW recycling sectors, funding to prevent illegal waste dumping actions and new waste infrastructure funding.

And what of the future? A **Waste to Energy policy paper** is due soon and will consider the role such activities can deliver for NSW. Considerable planning challenges await waste to energy projects, so what policy levers can the NSW Government provide for such important infrastructure?
