8.30 am WEBINAR OVERVIEW

This webinar will discuss the ability of new waste infrastructure, largely recycling, to be installed to meet NSW's Government's waste plans to avoid running out of landfill space, which is acute in the Sydney area. What will need to be installed and operational over the next critical 5 to 10 years to avoid the Sydney area becoming a significant waste exporter. The NSW Government has already flagged Sydney area will run out of inert landfill by 2028. This webinar will look at the ability of NSW to approve necessary infrastructure, including landfills to increase existing landfill life. It will explore cost impacts on waste management over the near future.

Energy from Waste is touted as a major method to save landfill space, but how effective is the EfW policy framework to achieve this? In addition, the impacts on RDF and PDF from this framework will be also considered.

Plastic waste management is progressing fast. A look at a proposed Advanced Recycling facility provides some good news in the currently poorly area of plastic recycling. Getting source materials for new recycling ventures requires good contracts especially where multiple Councils are involved and will be discussed.

Asbestos is a unique contaminant in recycling leading to significant legal risks for the producers and consumers of recycled C&D waste. What these are, will be also discussed. Use of the Resource Recovery framework a major method to divert waste from landfill, but suffers from increasing requirements and legal issues which will be discussed. Recent proposed EPA changes to RROEs paint the way forward for C&D recycling, but what will this mean for the construction and waste industries.
