## 28, 29 & 30 MAY 2024 – WEBINAR - 3 x 1.1 HOUR SESSIONS

This seminar set is designed to help environmental professionals come up to speed on the complex area of waste classification, resource recovery, and its management. Queensland environmental laws establish a complex set of legal controls on contaminated soils, waste generation, transport, re-use, recycling, treatment and disposal of wastes. Webinar is run over three sessions [3 x 1 hour sessions] plus question time will cover the following areas:

- ✓ Waste offences: → Environmental harm and illegal landfilling, illegal treatment and other offences

- ✓ Waste levies increases including changes for exempt Contaminated soil
- ✓ Transport conditions for wastes
- ✓ Landfilling criteria and recycling for both on and off-site activities
- ✓ Management of asbestos waste
- ✓ Use of End of Waste Codes → where they apply and what to do to implement them
- ✓ Waste Classification of non-trackable wastes
- ✓ Regulated Waste classification:
  - Using the desktop approach
  - Undertaking analysis to change Regulated Waste Category
- ✓ Hazardous waste → typical landfill acceptance criteria
- ✓ Immobilisation → what is it and where to use it and approval processes
- ✓ Waste tracking → waste codes, intra state and interstate
